RESOLUTION #2023-36 Resolution Approving the Central Disposal Systems Planning Area 2024 Solid Waste Comprehensive Plan Update

WHEREAS, section 455B.302 of the Code of Iowa requires every city and county of this state to provide for the establishment and operation of a comprehensive solid waste reduction program consistent with the waste management hierarchy under section 455B.301A, and a sanitary disposal project for final disposal of solid waste by its residents; and

WHEREAS, section 455B.306(1) of the Code of Iowa requires that all cities and counties file with the director of the department of natural resources a comprehensive plan detailing the method by which the city or county will comply with the requirements of section 455B.302 to establish and implement a comprehensive solid waste reduction program for its residents; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive plan, as described in section 455B.306 of the Code of Iowa has been prepared at the direction of and in participation with the <u>Central Disposal Landfill</u> by SCS Engineers, and dated <u>November 1, 2023</u>; and

WHEREAS, the <u>Central Disposal Landfill</u> has determined that the adoption and implementation of the proposed comprehensive plan is in the best interest of the <u>Central Disposal Landfill</u> with respect to satisfying <u>Central Disposal Landfill</u> statutory duties.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE <u>County of Worth</u> that the proposed comprehensive plan is hereby adopted as the comprehensive solid waste reduction plan of the <u>Central Disposal Landfill</u>.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the <u>Central Disposal Landfill</u> shall implement and participate in the programs set forth in the comprehensive plan.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the comprehensive plan shall be submitted to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources, on behalf of the <u>Central Disposal Landfill</u> in satisfaction of section 455B.306(1) of the Code of Iowa. November 13, 2023
